#### Motions for the FSR AGM 2016, 24.04.2016

#### **NSRV Motion No. 1:**

# Project Championship (variation to the FSR DTN proposal by Sebastien Dupoux)

Dear Board members of the FSR,

The NSRV supports the general concept of the proposals put together by the FSR with the NLA, Excellence A, NLB Elite, NLB Regular and NLC.

However for initial transition phase starting in season 2016/2017 we feel the  $1^{\rm st}$  League should be kept with a minor restructuring and the  $2^{\rm nd}$  Teams of the NLB foreseen for the "Excellence B" league are allocated to a group within the  $1^{\rm st}$  league.

Until the  $2^{nd}$  teams and new clubs development is at a level where a more rigid system is viable, merging the  $1^{st}$  League into the NLC will be a safety and financial risk for new/small teams.

The NSRV motion accepts the FSR proposal of the leagues NLA, Excellence A, NLB Elite, NLB Regular and NLC from next season but maintaining the 1<sup>st</sup> League with two groups. One initially primarily/exclusively NLB 2<sup>nd</sup> teams and another group for single teams, new clubs and any additional 2<sup>nd</sup> teams of a similar level. It will be for the Technical Teams in the FSR, Regions and Clubs to determine the best placing for the teams.

Important is to enable flexibility to adapt the structure as the teams situation determines.

Additionally as part of this NSRV Motion we propose to amend the playoff system between the NLB Elite and NLB Regular:

- Play-off / play out phase:
  - o Top 3 of each group in Play-off / other 3 in Play out
  - o Results against the 2 other teams coming in next phase are kept
  - o Home / away games against the 3 teams of the other side
- 10 + 6 games: 16 games in a season
- Up/down played on 10 games instead of 5


The Excellence B league will reamin a goal and a test run would be ideal in the framework of the  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$  League.

## Illustration of the Teams in the NSRV Motion.



  - 10 + 6 games: 16 games in a season
  - Up/down played on 10 games instead of 5



# 1st league

Total 12/13 teams (*potential new teams*) in two groups. Playoff's NLC/1<sup>st</sup> League could follow the current formula or a variation thereof.

LNC no. 6 (or 5 & 6)
1L no. 1 (excluding 2<sup>nd</sup> Teams) (or 1 & 2)
```

The team that wins most points stays or is promoted to NLC. Other factors to consider as current rules are stability of the team, sufficient financial resources and a referee!

Grouping could be split closer to region logic, but  $2^{nd}$  teams always scheduled to play with  $1^{st's}$ .

The 1<sup>st</sup> League continues it function as a development league, including, where appropriate, U19 rules for scrums etc.

Two rounds completed by early spring, match dates weekends 3. September – 5. November 2016 and from the of weekend 18. March 2017. This takes into account normal pitch availability in most NSRV/AJRL clubs (some pitches closed 1. November – 31. March).



#### (+ Interlaken (target Season 2017/2018))



A "Third round" should be considered with available teams in one off matches after the initial rounds are completed. Some teams will be unavailable in the spring due to exams of the dominant student and military service profiles.

New recruits and ex Juniors should get the opportunity to play in spring, alongside the sevens tournaments.

The NLC/1<sup>st</sup> league season should be completed by late May.

The third round does not count for points, at least in the initial phase of one or two seasons.

With more clubs and teams in the future, this  $1^{st}$  League solution should be reorganised into the proposed Excellence B for NLB  $2^{nd}$  Teams, but we still need a  $1^{st}$  league for new clubs and teams.

Leaving out the  $2^{nd}$  Teams for now in the  $1^{st}$  League risks a very thin team base or mixing unprepared teams in an extended NLC.

Estimating teams for season 2016/2017 based on the current status (23. March 2016) is too uncertain to put in any inflexible structure for the lower divisions clubs. 2<sup>nd</sup> Teams are still relatively new in the history of Swiss rugby.
